MESSAGE FROM THE CIO

We are introducing this DAF CIO Quarterly Newsletter to inform you on significant activities in our office and across the enterprise. Of course, we want to know what interests you, so if you have questions, recommendations, or if there are things you think we really need to get the word out on, please provide them via our <u>feedback form</u> (CAC enabled)!

This quarter I had the opportunity to visit our Airmen and Guardians at Osan, Kunsan, Yokota, Kadena, Andersen, and Hickam. I learned much about the unique missions sets in that expansive AOR and got to truly experience the "tyranny of distance," as well as the challenges they present to the warfighter. Across the AOR I saw great progress in replacing our end-of-life (EOL) equipment (our biggest driver of UX and cybersecurity) and unprecedented alignment between MAJCOM innovators and the enterprise to modernize infrastructure to best posture us to support the future fight.

The recently published DAF CIO strategy outlines our plans to accelerate change across six priority LOEs to modernize DAF Enterprise IT. We've begun work on implementation of the first 25 strategic objectives for FY23. The strategy and latest updates are available on our website: https://www.safcn.af.mil/

Over the past year, we've made substantial progress improving User Experience (UX) by streamlining Group Policy Objects (GPOs), simplifying our security environment, and upgrading 200,000 computer systems, with many more still trickling in with end of year funds. We've also upgraded circuits and EOL network equipment at multiple bases and fixed major UX issues with Outlook and Adobe. Our UX scores are up about 15 points since November of last year, and we recently pinned the rose on the 38th to operationalize UX and keep driving these scores higher. What's next? We've tested a new GPO approach that goes from 1900 policies down to 42, with huge UX benefits. Some lucky users are already experiencing a 200% improvement. This approach will start scaling enterprise wide in Jan 2023 so we can share the wealth with all.

More will be discussed at our quarterly CIO Jam in January. We encourage you to attend and engage!

DAF CDAO JOINS SAF/CN!

The Department of the Air Force Chief Data & Artificial Intelligence Office (CDAO) is now part of SAF/CN! We are excited to welcome the CDAO with the new designation of SAF/CND.

CYBER CIVILIAN CAREER FIELD NAME CHANGE

The civilian Communications & Information career field was officially redesignated to the Cyberspace & Information Technology career field on 1 July 22.

GLOBAL FEDERATED USER DIRECTORY

On November 1, 2022, the DAF transitioned to the Global Federated User Directory (GFUD). The overall transition was a success for a majority of the users. GFUD was implemented in compliance with a DoD CIO mandate and increased our cyber security posture by reducing dormant accounts and the threats they posed to our information environment. As the instantiation of the DoD-wide Identity Control solution, these are the first steps to establishing our Zero Trust Environment.

WEEKLY REBOOTS, FASTER SYSTEMS

Many performance and stability problems can be resolved by regularly restarting your computer. Installation of some Windows updates can only be completed only after a full shutdown. In order to ensure pending updates are completed, regularly do a full reboot by choosing 'Restart' from the Power menu.

PLANNER FOR TASK MANAGEMENT

Use Microsoft Planner Kanban boards to streamline your task management process and collaborate with your team in real time. Planner automatically visualizes task status into pie and bar charts with no setup required.
